We who were born before 1940 must be a hardy bunch when you think of the way in which the world has changed and the adjustments we have had to make. No wonder we are so confused and there is a generation gap today . . .

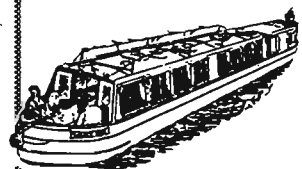

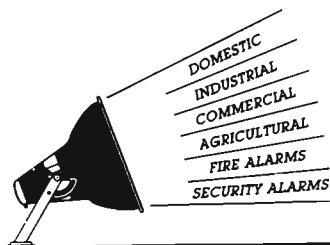

now been submitted and was given serious consideration by the Parish Council. As quarries go, this could be much worse. The access will remain at Rothersthorpe and the agreed routes for lorries do not pass through Bugbrooke. Two immediate concerns are that the diverted footpath should be made secure and fenced with dogproof netting; and that, although the inert waste to be used for infill is not likely to be hazardous, it would be preferable to use soil only, as ultimately there could be a loss in the quality of the agricultural land. There are also grave reservations about the proposals to encourage the badgers recently returned to the village to stay put whilst their immediate world is destroyed. The whole process is expected to last four years.

The Jack Holt Memorial Walk will take place on Sunday afternoon the 16th June (his birthday). It will involve a gentle stroll of about 1 to 1½ hours, including a view of Charity Meadow, a designated site of special scientific interest (SSSI) in which Jack Holt took a particular interest. All are welcome and details will be posted on the noticeboards.

PC Wallace attended his last meeting at Bugbrooke to provide information on the latest crime figures. They showed a reduction in most categories of crime over the past 12 months (or, if we are cynical, reflected a different system of gathering information). Car crime in the area certainly reduced significantly when two likely lads (not from Bugbrooke) were apprehended. PC Wallace has now transferred to Deanshanger and we wish him every success. Following Wallace is not Gromit (much to the disappointment of Phil Bignell) but PC Gary Wood. The Parish Council hopes to be able to work closely with him towards a crime-free environment.

The Local Government Commission is now carrying out a review of electoral arrangements in South Northamptonshire. The aim is for the District Council to have one Councillor elected for every 1,200 electors. A strict application of this criterion would leave Bugbrooke with 1½ Councillors! The risk is that the Commission, not recognising that villages often have different needs and aspirations, will create artificial conglomerations in order to match their arbitrary figures. The Parish Council has confirmed that we require two District Councillors, representing only Bugbrooke, as at present.

Once again a glossy brochure announcing BT's Environment Week has been produced. The Parish Council might be a little more enthusiastic about this event, and a little less likely to regard it as a cynical public relations exercise, if it were not for recent experience, when BT not only refused to join a joint scheme to 'underground' wires in the High Street but subsequently erected three additional poles in the village, one in the Conservation Area. It is still hoped to remove at least one pole and some wires to improve the street scene in the High Street but this must be funded almost entirely by the Parish Council.

Finally, the Parish Council received information about International

## Bugbrooke Sports & Community Centre

A disappointing turnout for the AGM means that the committee will be some members short of its quota for the elected group. Therefore there will be space for some coopted members and if you wish to participate in the running of the Playing Fields and development of new facilities please let me know in order to put your name forward.

The Playing Fields Tote is no longer being collected due to the gradual reduction, over a number of years, of collectors and contributors. The committee would like to thank those who have contributed and particularly those who have made the effort to collect the amounts concerned. The Tote has allowed individuals to support the Playing Fields, for several years these funds have generated many of the facilities available.

The Community Hall project inches closer and it is envisaged that alternative fund raising options may become available when it is opened. We hope those who have supported us in the past with Tote contributions will be able to come and enjoy the facilities their efforts have helped to make possible.

It's good to see the new cricket square being used for the first time although it has made little change to the weather which was windy and wet! The outfield is already quite fast with the grass cut short and the previously dry weather ensuring a hard surface.

The scouts and bowls have started the construction of their new hall and garage facilities and the foundations are now in place. This section of work was undertaken by a band of volunteers armed with rakes and shovels determined to shift the 30 cubic metres of concrete before it set around their feet. ## Bugbrooke Neighbourhood Watch

Although we have not yet received the full crime figures for the quarter, we are assured by Mick Wallace, our community constable, that his whole beat shows improvement, with the villages of Bugbrooke and Harpole showing the greatest improvement. In general, the trend for car related crime seems to be down, but thefts from garages, sheds, and gardens are rising.

There have been a series of 'Distraction' thefts reported, in which the

householder's attention is held by one thief, whilst his companion steals what he can from the house. A common ploy seems to be for the thief to ask the householder to change a large denomination note, thus allowing him to see where money is kept. Sometimes, the thieves pose as council officials, or gas or electricity inspectors.

Police advice is that you should not admit strangers to your home without checking on their identity. Keep a chain on your front door, and the back door locked. Don't be afraid to check identity documents, and to telephone the body whom your caller claims to represent for confirmation.

Our telephone cascade system for passing information around the village had shown itself to have some shortcomings, so it has now been redrafted, and we hope that it will now function smoothly.

Finally, with the Holiday season upon us, may we remind you to be sure that before you go, you remember to cancel milk and newspaper deliveries, and to arrange with a neighbour to ensure that letters etc are not left protruding from your letterbox to advertise the fact that you are away from home.

## Nurse's Corner

### Hayfever

A recent survey showed that although most hayfever sufferers do visit their doctor, there is a sizeable number who take nothing for their symptoms. Perhaps they are unaware that there are effective treatments. Hayfever restricts performance in young people at a bad time of year – exam time! Almost 50% of those aged 5–19 felt hayfever had a bad effect on their lessons or lectures. Symptoms include sneezing, watery eyes, runny nose, itchy, sensitive eyes, blocked nose/sinuses and headaches.

Although hayfever is a seasonal reaction to pollen, there is an increased susceptibility to irritants such as smoke, animal fur and emotional stress once the season has begun. Your local pharmacist will be able to advise you on simple remedies, but if these don't work for you, do consult your local nurse or doctor.

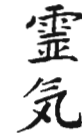

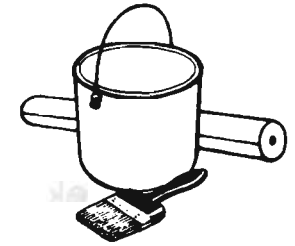
