Nature Notes by Bill Lantsbery



I think I made an error at the end of my last notes. I wrote that the magnolia was ruined because it had been struck by frost. As a matter of fact it had been hit by an air frost and we did not have another one. It recovered and that tree has never looked so well. I went down to it this morning, 26 June, and it still had three flowers on it. That is eight weeks since the frost.

Mrs Anne Bird told me a good story about a tame falcon. She said that on 15 May a tame falcon landed on a telephone pole near her home. It would just not go away and when Anne offered it some strips of beef it ate every piece and would have taken more. Anne consulted the Yellow Pages book and she came across the name of Daniel Keeber. He is the youngest Falconer in Northamptonshire. He arrived about eight o'clock, put a hood over the bird's head and took it away.

The flycatcher arrived on the same day as the falcon, but it has not nested here this year. I see from my diary that last year it arrived on 18 May!

Mr Len Rudkin told me that one day he saw a sparrowhawk eating a bird on his lawn!

Phil Bignell, from The Paddocks, tells me that the albino thrush that is about here has mated with another ordinary thrush and they have raised a family in a nest at the end of his garden. He says his paved garden path is littered with snail shells and they have to sweep them off time after time. Thrushes certainly keep the snail population down a bit.

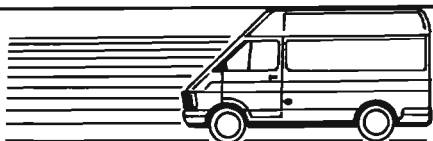

Parish Council Meetings - May and June 1996

After much work in Committee, the Parish Council has adopted a series of policies which will guide all future decisions. The agreed policy document covers all areas, from economic to the environment. Whilst some of these policies may represent an idealistic (or even Utopian) position, the document provides a framework on which to build a more detailed programme, with target dates for achieving those (sadly few) areas of provision which are within our powers. This programme can then be incorporated into the budgetary process. The policy document, which will be reviewed annually, will be published in Link. Any comments or observations on them will be welcomed.

In May, Mr Keith Edwards, the Regional Customer Services Manager of Anglian Water, attended the Parish Council Meeting in response to our suggestion that they could introduce an insurance scheme for households served by unadopted sewers. (If a sewer is unadopted, all maintenance and repair costs remain the responsibility of the householders.) After a positive and useful discussion, Mr Edwards undertook to examine the possibility of such an insurance scheme and to identify all those properties in Bugbrooke affected. We await his reply with interest.

There is increasing frustration with the infrequent cutting of grass verges throughout the village. Whilst it is not the responsibility of the Parish Council to carry out this work, the time may have arrived to grasp the nettle (both literally and figuratively) and employ our own village mower.

Bugbrooke Parish Council has been invited by South Northamptonshire Council to form a pilot community forum with Harpole, Heyford and Kislingbury. The forum will raise issues of concern to these parishes and, in theory, suggest realistic local solutions to local problems. This will be the first scheme of its kind in South Northamptonshire and our selection to be involved was no doubt influenced by our successful establishment of the Mid-Northamptonshire group of 22 parishes concerned about the development and expansion of Northampton into rural areas.

A Rural Symposium, organised by the County Planning Forum, took place at Campion School. When volunteering to attend this rather grandly named event I was influenced by the dictionary definition of a symposium as a 'drinking party'. My disappointment quickly disappeared, however, when I realised that we were to be addressed by the Government Minister with responsibilities for rural areas, and speakers from the European Community and the County Council. We were also provided with an opportunity to discuss with these policy formers the issues and problems affecting rural areas. It was an interesting day, but

BUGBROOKE PARISH COUNCIL POLICY DOCUMENT

ECONOMIC

- EP1 The Parish Council recognises that the countryside has always been a place of work, albeit mainly agricultural, and will support other areas of appropriate economic activity which is satisfactorily located and congruous with the size and character of the village
- EP2 The Parish Council recognises that a Post Office is a focal point of the village and will support and encourage its continued existence

ENVIRONMENT (GREEN)

- GP1 To encourage a responsible attitude to waste disposal matters
- GP2 That every effort be made to encourage local, regional and national bodies to resolve the problem of unadopted sewers
- GP3 To remove all wires, poles and other intrusions which detract from the visual environment, particularly those within the Conservation Area
- GP4 That all Village Greens and Common Land within the village be registered under the Commons Registration Act and be properly maintained
- GP5 To ensure that street lighting is maintained at an appropriate standard
- GP6 That tree planting in approved planning applications and agreed replacement of trees under Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) be carefully monitored to ensure compliance

- HP1 The Parish Council recognises the wish of many people who live in Bugbrooke to remain in the village despite their changing housing needs

- PP6 That the Parish Council support the designation of the Conservation Area and the proposals designed to maintain or enhance the distinctive character of the area

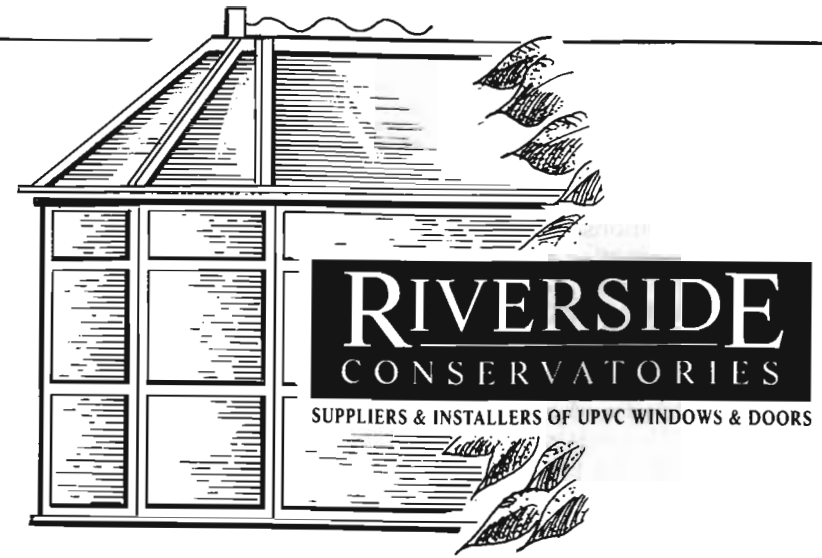

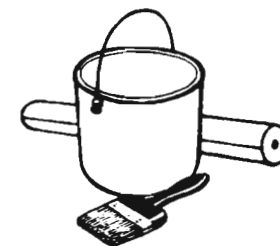
