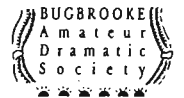

Bugbrooke History Research Society

The group was formed in February with the purpose of putting together a Village History to be published for the millennium in the year 2000.

There are currently 15 members. Everyone has been allocated an area of research and any information that can be passed on to them regarding their various areas of study would be appreciated.

The recorders and their topics are: John Terry and Bob Peel (pre-history, Roman, Anglo-Saxon and Doomsday periods), Bruce Piper (Middle Ages - 19th Century), David Jeffery (Agriculture and Milling), Sylvia Wyles (Population and Housing), Mary Chapell and Hazel Kitchener (Industry), Roy Smith (Local interviews with elderly residents), Tim Partridge and Alec Shaw (Religion), Pat Kent (Education), John Curtis (Sport and Geology), Alan and Barbara Parr (Street names and local connections), Andrew Maltby (Secretary and item recorder).

It is hoped that research will be concluded by the end of 1997. Two years will then be spent editing the information and publishing it by 2000.

In order to make the finished product as interesting as possible the group would like to incorporate photographs and maps. If anyone has any photos or maps of historical interest (ie relating to the wars or village events of the past) it would be appreciated if they would allow them to be copied and incorporated in the book. Exercise

Apparently there are more obese people than ever before in this country, and it's mostly due to a sedentary lifestyle than a poor diet. Bugbrooke Sports and Community Centre

This letter has been sent to Pilgrims Lane residents.

The B.S.A.C.C. wish to inform you, as a matter of courtesy, that during September contractors' vehicles will be using Pilgrims Lane for access to the Playing Fields. This is for site clearance and construction of a community centre and car park adjacent to the new bowls green.

The original plan was to access the whole development via a new road off Camp Hill, to be provided by South Northants Council. However the plan was thwarted by certain local complications, which have now been overcome, and S.N.C. are committed to have the road in place within 6 months.

To delay the community centre project further until the new road is available has cost implications for the B.S.A.C.C. Therefore it is necessary for Pilgrims Lane to be the alternative access, at least for the initial stages of the development.

The contractor will use the new access as soon as possible and entrance to the Playing Fields from Pilgrims Lane will eventually be pedestrian only.

Parish Council Meetings – July and August 1996

The Parish Council continue to meet during the holiday season. One recurring theme is the usual summer problem of foliage overhanging footways (in one or two cases being so severe as to smother a street light) and crops obstructing footpaths. Most of these situations are beyond the capability of the volunteer path clearers and remain the responsibility of the owners.

There is to be a joint British Waterways/South Northamptonshire Council Scheme to improve the landscaping and access to the Canal. The Parish Council has submitted a list of desirable work involving, in order of priority: an upgrade of the towpath north and south of the Wharf; improved access from bridge nos. 36 (Wharf), 38 (Rainbows), 40 (Birds Hill), 41 (Gayton Road), 35 (Old Crown); clearance of spoil and landscaping of canal alongside Pinnegar and Barnes; stabilise bank between canal and railway and landscape to provide screen; and the management of the hedgerows along the towpath to improve habitat for flora and fauna. In addition, the Footpaths Committee will devise a circular walk leaflet based on the Canal through the village and endeavour to persuade the appropriate body to print and publish it.

One or two minor accidents and the complete absence of police has drawn the attention of the Parish Council to the increased incidence of illegal parking throughout the village. This problem has been referred to the Police for appropriate action. The Parish Council still yearn for the return of the village bobby who was part of the community and could be seen walking around the village. Police forces in other parts of the country are returning to this system so we live in hope for such an enlightenment in Northamptonshire.

The proposed floodlit all-weather pitch and swimming pool at Campion School has caused concern to some residents of nearby houses. After careful consideration, the Parish Council has asked for certain changes to the plans so that the car park is not adjoining the adjacent properties. Also suggested is appropriate landscaping to provide screening, various measures to reduce noise, limited opening hours and the careful control of the increased traffic, preferably with separate entry and exit points off Kislingbury Road.

Increased traffic was also a concern with the proposal to build a pharmacy on the side of the surgery at the top of Levitts Road. Again, certain improvements and traffic calming measures have been suggested.

Continuing the roads theme, the County Council were informing parishes that the Highways Agency had removed the Council's responsibility for trunk roads. The maintenance of these roads and verges would now be put out to tender. There was concern that this could lead to a further deterioration and the Highways Agency has been informed accordingly.

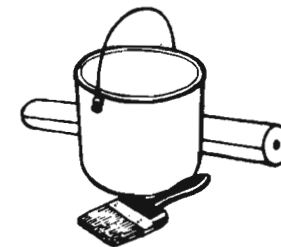
