ADAMS, A., Sapper Royal Engineers (R.O.D.)

Shortly after joining in February 1917, he was sent to the Western Front, where he was engaged on important duties on the railways on various sectors. He was also present at the Battles of Ypres, Cambrai, the Somme, Amiens and Le Cateau and served through the final Advance of 1918. Demobilised in November 1919, he holds the General Service and Victory Medals.

Additional Information:

Alfred's parents, Alfred and Harriet, were born in Northampton, as were Alfred Junior and his elder sister Harriet Junior. By 1901 the family had moved to Bugbrooke with Alfred senior working as a shoe finisher. Ten years later and Alfred junior was working as a farm labourer. His sister Harriet was missing, possibly one of the 2 children who died in childhood, and he had a younger brother Arthur.
