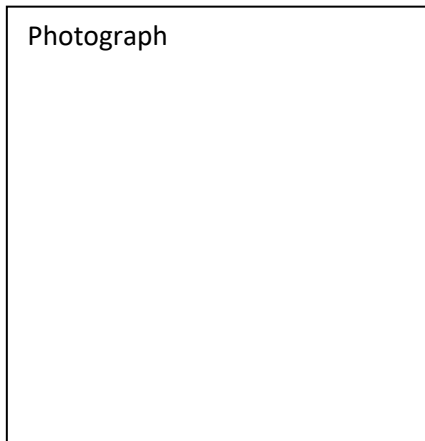

Arthur CAMPION was one of seven children of John CAMPION and his wife Sarah. Before the war, Arthur was employed as an Auctioneer's Assistant in Rugby. His parents had both died by then, his father in late 1895 and his mother in mid-1906.

Arthur enlisted (or, more likely, was conscripted) as a private soldier ('Gunner') in the Royal Garrison Artillery (RGA), numbered 81796. He served with 196 Heavy Battery, RGA, in France and qualified for the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

He married the young Doris BUSWELL, born in Northamptonshire but then living in Rugby, in 1925, and died in September 1930, in Rugby. Doris died in March 1990, registered in Daventry.
