Private, D Company, 2nd Battalion, Northamptonshire Regiment. No. 8258 and 70395. In receipt of the British and Victory medals, the 1914 Star, with clasp and roses, signifying he was under fire in 1914.

In 1881, he was living with his parents and four siblings at Titchmarsh. His father was a farmer of 50 acres.

In 1891 he was living with his uncle in Hornsey, Middlesex, employed as a merchants clerk. His younger brother Earnest was also living there.

In 1901, he was married to Sarah A King who was born in Hornsey with a 2 year old Elias. He was a Commercial Accountant.

In 1911, he was a farmer at Littliff Farm, Bugbrooke, married to Lizzie with children Bertie 12 and Eileen 9. Both children were born in Highgate, London, the birthplace of Lizzie.
