Information

On enlisting, he stated his age as 18years 6 months (actually 16 years from census records). Height was 5ft 4", and chest fully expanded 33 inches. Physical condition – poor.

Enlisted in the East Midlands Brigade of the Territorial Army Service Corps, no. 243468 and served as a driver. Discharged 16th July 1920, after injury on duty during field service. He suffered from tuberculosis of the shoulder joint, first noticed while digging in the spring of 1918 whilst in Palistine, but not reported until November 1918.

First 2 years of the war were served in UK (home). In 1916 he was transferred to the regular army from the territorials and sent overseas. Between 12th September 1917 and 2nd April 1919 he was in Egypt, and then was moved back to the UK where he remained until discharged in 1920.
