Information

Born in Eastcote in 1871, in 1911 census was a Captain in the 2nd Battalion Cheshire Regiment.

In 23rd March 1910, he departed on the P&O ship Mantua, for Bombay ,India.

In the 1911 census he was a soldier living at the Ridge, Juddalore, India, aged 39 and married.

He died in 1943 aged 71.

2nd Battalion

August 1914 : in Jubbulpore, India. Returned to England, landing at Devonport on 24 December 1914.

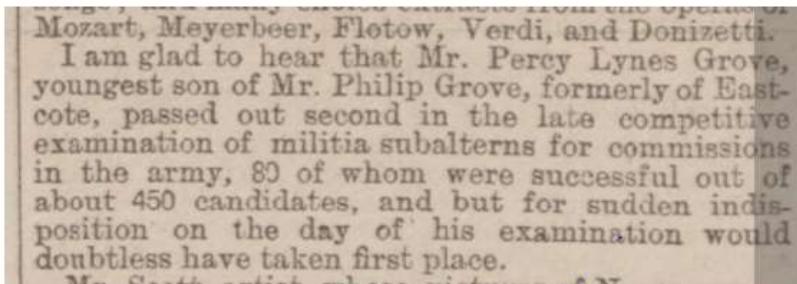
Came under orders of 84th Brigade, 28th Division, at Winchester. Landed at Le Havre 17 January 1915.

Moved in October 1915 to Egypt and then on to Salonika.

12 January 1916 : the 1st Manx (Service) Company joined and became 'A' Company.

The 'Mention in Despatches' for Temporary Lieutenant-Colonel Percy Lynes Grove, Cheshire Regiment (serving at the 'Small Arms School, India') was announced in the *London Gazette* Supplement of 26 November 1918 at page 13907, at the end of a long despatch from the C-in-C India. (It would appear that Grove spent the war in India, earning a single British War Medal - as for all those on such 'Garrison Duty' in India - without the Victory Medal that automatically accompanied it for those who served in a 'Theatre of War', such as France and Flanders, Mesopotamia, the Dardanelles and so on - which did not include the UK mainland either). (It is likely that he was never actually in the Indian Army)
